



## NOTICE OF RACE

### 2019 Terrell E. Cobb Memorial Cuttyhunk Race

#### Twenty Hundred Club

Saturday July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019, 1030

#### 1. RULES

- a. The organizing authority is the Twenty Hundred Club.
- b. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 – 2020*.
- c. RRS 52 (Manual Power) is modified such that power-driven winches and furlers are permitted.
- d. The protest committee may impose a penalty other than a DSQ which may include a warning. This changes rule 64.1.
- e. All participating yachts will comply with the US Safety Equipment Requirements published by US Sailing for the “US Nearshore” racing category. The requirements are available here:

#### 2. ELIGIBILITY

- a. The Race is open to all yachts with a current PHRF-NB rating.
- b. Identifying numbers must be displayed on the mainsail.

#### 3. ENTRY PROCEDURES & FEES

- a. Participants must register with the Twenty Hundred Club on their website ([www.twentyhundredclub.org](http://www.twentyhundredclub.org)).
- b. Yachts may participate in the following classes:
  - i. Spinnaker
  - ii. Cruising (Non-spinnaker)
- c. It is expected that divisions within each class will NOT be used. There will be only one start for all participants. Refer to the SI and scratch sheet for confirmation.

#### 4. EVENT HEADQUARTERS

- a. NA

#### 5. SCHEDULE

- a. Racing will begin at 1035 on Saturday, July 20<sup>th</sup>. Other details of the race schedule will be announced in the sailing instructions.
- b. A preliminary scratch sheet will be posted at [www.twentyhundredclub.org](http://www.twentyhundredclub.org) by Monday, July 15<sup>th</sup>. A final scratch sheet will be posted in the morning of Friday, July 19<sup>th</sup>.

#### 6. RACING

- a. There is one race with 2 classes for scoring purposes (spinnaker and non-spinnaker).
- b. Courses are defined in the SI. There will be a “long” course and a “short” course, with the decision as to which course to be used made on Saturday July 20<sup>th</sup> prior to the start sequence. In general the start will be in the vicinity of Rose Island G “3” GONG and the finish will be in the vicinity of Middle Ground Buoy RG N “MG”.

#### 7. POST RACE



- a. There will be a friendly review of results at the commercial pier and public landing in Cuttyhunk Harbor at 2000, July 20<sup>th</sup>.

## **8. SCORING**

- a. The Low Point Scoring System Appendix A of the Racing Rules will apply, as modified by the sailing instructions.

## **9. PENALTY SYSTEM**

- a. In accordance with the SI.

## **11. PRIZES**

- a. Awards will be presented at the Twenty Hundred Club Spring Dinner to be announced separately.

## **12. WAIVER OF LIABILITY**

- a. Competitors participate in this regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The Organizing Authorities will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
- b. Each competitor participating in the regatta shall submit an online Liability and Media Waiver (a part of the Twenty Hundred Club registration process) prior to racing.
- c. Participants are encouraged (but not required) to use Race Qs at [www.raceqs.com](http://www.raceqs.com) to self-report your race. A free account for your boat is required. A free iOS or Android app is required. A "Cuttyhunk Race" site hosted by RaceQs will be available to upload data and view a participant replay.
